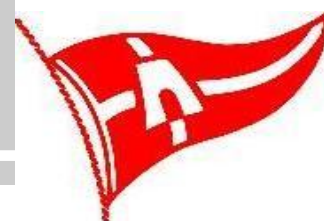

COMMODORES MESSAGE

This year's two, long standing commitments of the Club's resources had resolutions of interest. First, the project of rerouting power to the Club, began at least three years ago, was finally completed. The Bank of St Croix loan conceived to fix the septic system, build the perimeter fence and move the power and phone lines, was expended successfully and efficiently to include the purchase and installation of a new generator. Due to amazing delays from St Croix's utility companies these projects took persistence and determination, as displayed by volunteers Tully Keith, Taylor Babb and Morgan Dale.

Secondly, our commitment to our community to sustain the International Regatta for the benefit of Caribbean sailing, for its impact on the Cruzan economy, and for the enjoyment of our own racers and volunteers led us to partner with Continuum Care Hospice, enabling significant fundraising while increasing our Club's visibility with donors. Our Club members are people who care enough to see a need, willing (and sometimes brave) enough to step up and lend a hand, and perceptive enough to know that those acts of participation increase the value of their own Club experience. My heartfelt thanks to this entire wonderful group of people. The members of your Board of Directors are

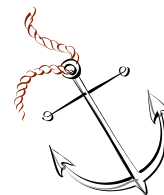
especially to be commended for their dedication and selfless hours of contribution.

FROM THE FLEET CAPTAIN

We had a fun year on the water in 2010! Starting with Around St. Croix Race and the Hospice Regatta, carrying on with One Design, High School, and Rhodes 19 racing, there were plenty of opportunities for everyone to get out on the water. Our Cruzan Open One Design Regatta, now in its 10th year, had a great turnout, including a team visiting from Anguilla! We had a fantastic “race” to town and back, incorporating a poker run along the way, and more Rhodes 19's out than we've ever had before! I'm really excited to see the Lasers getting back out again too.....

Many thanks to all those who supported our Junior Sailors Auction, “Charting a Course towards the Future”! We raised enough money to begin some much needed upgrades to our fleet and east side facilities—including a new coach/utility boat, and much needed sails for our fleet! Thanks again, everyone!

We are still working on our docks and mooring field. An ongoing project is to better manage our mooring area, before DPNR starts doing it for us. A big step in the process was the computerized mapping of the mooring field, developed by Orris Scribner, posted on the bulletin board by the breezeway—Thanks Orris!! If you can identify any of the moorings shown, please write it down. We are seeing more and more moorings installed each year, and need to develop a master plan to manage these. If you have ideas, let me know, and please consider joining our Dock & Mooring Committee—we'll be busy!

Our launching area is another area for concern, and planning. Larger boats are using our “ramp”, which is showing quite a bit of wear and tear. I'm not sure where the cutoff will be, but at some point, we may have to limit the size and weight of boats launching. A suggested limit is 1000 lbs. per wheel—not realistic for most motorboats. The once smooth, grassy bottom in this area is now silted, soft, and full of craters, making it even harder to launch. Please plan your hauling and launching for the high tide, and do not use your engines to pull your boat off the trailer.

A big welcome to our new Waterfront Coordinator, Caitlyn Connolly, who has brought a ton of energy and good ideas to our High School, Optimist programs and Waterfront Education Programs. We are seeing more kids out sailing than ever before, and more opportunities for them to sail and learn — Great Job, Caitlyn!

As always, thanks to Kiomie, Roserene, and Dennis for all the work they do. They really make our Club what it is. Thank them when you see them, and ask what you can do to help!

It has been a pleasure to work with this Board, and I wish the new Board good luck going forward.

FROM THE WATERFRONT COORDINATOR:

Mooring Field Mapping

I have begun to compile an accurate and up-to-date database of all of the boats/moorings within Teague Bay. The project is one that has been in the works for quite a while and requires constant updating. Recently a member was kind enough to go out to the field and take the GPS coordinates of all of the moorings within the harbor. The information was then plotted on a chart of the harbor to create an accurate account of everything that was in Teague Bay. I have posted this information on the bulletin board at the Club, as well as in my office. The goal is to identify the owner of each mooring, as well as pin point inactive moorings that may be subject to removal. As each of you come out to the Club for your weekend fun in the sun, please be so kind as to fill in the information that may be missing next to your moorings slot. The numbers on the moorings coincide with a list of coordinates and small descriptions of what the mooring buoy looks like. Not only do I hope for this survey to keep me up to date on active vs. inactive moorings, but also help you (the members) to have a better idea of other vessels that surround you. *"Let me square the yards, while we may, old man, and make a fair wind of it homeward"* Moby Dick



Dry Storage Organization

With the growing number of boaters in our Yacht Club Community, it is imperative that I have accurate records to keep track of who has what on our dinghy racks, on our yard, or other storage locations. All privately owned property being stored on Yacht Club grounds, must have a **dry storage agreement** or **dock lease agreement** on file. When you turn in your dry storage agreement or dock lease agreement you will be assigned a color coded sticker and number. This allows us the ability to keep better track of your property. This will also allow for us to move that dilapidated un-used dinghy off the rack, and room for your sea worthy kayak! Please help me accomplish this goal by stopping in and filling out one of the agreements above.

Regatta Report

Orange Bowl: Sailors battled colder conditions than expected with highs in the 50's and 25 knots of breeze on the first day. Things warmed up and settled down as the days went on, and our sailors took advantage of the opportunity to sail against some of the most competitive sailors in the country. Overall these hard-working SCYC sailors left the Orange Bowl with far more knowledge and experience within the racing circuit, and some cold weather gear for their future endeavours.

MLK Regatta: Two Optimist sailors and four 420 sailors represented SCYC in St. Thomas. I am proud to say that everyone sailed well and the experience of sailing in new wind and waters was invaluable. Thanks to Captain Nick for taking a group of the kids over. Challis Diaz and Lillian Mallory took first place in 420's and Ryan Hunter held his own, rounding in first and finishing fourth place for one of the races. DJ Lorshbaugh and Thorn Nelthropp took second in 420's and Nati Kuipers rocked the waters as the sole female Green Fleet sailor, representing SCYC.

High School Sailing

The High School Sailing Team began its season with a steady 8-12 knot breeze and 6 boats on the starting line. This season is looking to have as many as 20 regular sailors from different high schools on the island. Of these 20 sailors, 10 are in the 9th grade or below. With such young sailors, the team is bound to be gaining strength as we go forward. The high school line up is as follows: 12 CDS Sailors, 3 Independent Sailors, 3 Good Hope Sailors, 1 Central Sailor, 1 Elena Christian Sailor. Practice began on January 11th and resumed its schedule of meeting 3 times weekly from 3:45 to 6:15.



Green Team & Optimist Race Team

Electric lights and motors are all well and fine for the big Christmas parade, if you like that kind of thing... But if you ask me that doesn't hold a candle to boats under their own power decorated with tree ornaments! I'm talking about the Great Christmas Parade put on by our Green Team and Racing Optimist sailors. This Fall, Green Team fine tuned skills such as Tacking and Gybing. They also worked hard on looking like racers in the boat with their "Feet Together, Knees together, and hands on their lap!" The Race Team mastered the art of "Ease, Hike, Trim" and started striving towards "Consistent, Clean, Starts." Overall, the program was a great success and we hope to see even bigger numbers in the Spring programs.

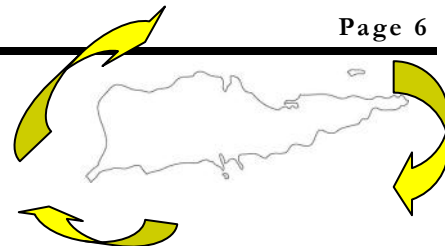


NOTICE OF RACE

Around St. Croix Race

St. Croix Yacht Club, Teague Bay

January 22 and 23, 2011

**Rules**

The race will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2009 -2012. The management of the race shall be by the designated race committee of St Croix Yacht Club which shall have the authority to decide all matters relating to this race. Rule 44.2 is in effect.

Friday, January 21

1800: Skipper's Meeting and Registration at SCYC in east room

Saturday, January 22

0700: Continental Breakfast SCYC

0900: First Warning Signal

1400: tender from boats to pier begins

1700: tender from boats to pier ends

1600: Celebration @ a west location Coconuts

1900: tender from dock to boats starts

2200: tender service ends

Sunday, January 23

0700: Continental Breakfast & Breakfast Burritos at Coconuts

0800: tender service begins

0900: First Warning Signal

0930: tender service ends

1700: Celebration at the YC

Racing Area and Course: The course will be from the starting line off of pull point, around St. Croix clockwise, beginning and ending in the vicinity of Pull Point, on St. Croix's north shore. The race will finish Saturday and start Sunday in the vicinity north of the end, of the pier, on St. Croix's West end. Leave all aids to navigation, including Hovensa channel markers, to starboard except yellow park buoys. There is a fixed can marker to mark the turn off of Sandy Point. The starting and finishing line off of Pull Point will be between the Committee Boat and a tetrahedron. The starting and finish line in Frederiksted will be due west from flag on the pier.

Scoring SCSA Ratings will be assigned by the Race Committee, and are subject to the Race Committee's adjustment. Particular care will be given to time considerations for True Cruising Class yachts, with allowances for liveboards, excess ground tackle, etc. Corrected times will be calculated using time-on-time. Both days corrected time will be combined for a total corrected time. CSA ratings will be used for those vessels that have them.

Prizes: Prizes will be awarded to the top three finishers in each class. Trophies will be awarded at the St Croix Yacht Club @ 1700.
