Enjoy winter moving into spring, and really enjoy our December winds for as long as they last. I wish you all fair winds and following seas.





- ✓ Until the new Point of Sale system is fully functional, you must pay your bill before leaving the club. We take Visa and MasterCard only.



Hawks flying south for winter training


The Roger Williams University Sailing team is delighted to be returning to the St. Croix Yacht Club for their annual winter training for the third year. Roger Williams loves sailing out of the St. Croix Yacht Club because the conditions are so reliable: the weather is warm, the water color is dreamy, the wind is strong and the island hospitality is amazing!!! The Hawks current and alumni families make this trip possible for them. They so appreciate members of the club who have gone out of their way to welcome the team to STX, and seeing sea turtles throughout practice is a huge bonus.

The trip has become a really important part of spring programming and development. It gives the team's younger sailors an intense and immersive team racing experience. By their calculations, the 3 days of training in St. Croix are equivalent to 2 weeks of regular practice at home. That's a huge boost!

The Hawks had a great fall season. They ended the semester ranked 7th among coed teams, and 20th in women's competition in the Sailing World College Rankings.

The coed Hawks finished 3rd at the NEISA conference championship and hometown hero and Hawk Mathieu Dale closed the season with 7th at the Men's Singlehanded championship. To wrap up the training trip, the Hawks are looking forward to teaming up with the St. Croix junior sailors for the regatta on January 21st. We love that it has become a staple part of the experience.

The New Dock

Dock materials are on the way and are likely to land on StX in the next 2 weeks. This will allow us to begin demolition with an expected start date in late January of 2024.

The new dock rebuild will consist of the walkway, tied into a concrete pad at the beginning to where the "T" used to be.

As for the "T" dock itself, given the number of pilings needed for it, and a price tag of over \$500k, this will have to wait a bit.

We're even being sustainable; with the pilings we currently have being refitted and reused for the new dock!



Coquito Ice Cream

This recipe is designed to be used with Stephanie Malanga's Coquito, so consume wisely as the alcohol content may knock you on your a*&!.

<u>Ingredients:</u>

- Eggs
- Coquito
- Heavy Cream
- Vanilla
- Sugar
- Nutmeg
- Cinnamon



Directions:


- 1. 13 Egg Yolks in a bowl and set aside (either throw away the whites or figure out a use for them)
- 2. Heat 2 cups Coquito, 2 Cups Heavy Cream and 2 Tbs Vanilla in a pot over low/med heat whisking constantly, add $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp Nutmeg, 1 tsp Cinnamon.
- 3. Add 3/4 cups of Sugar to your Egg Yolk bowl and mix well.
- 4. Once Coquito mixture is hot to the touch, add it a bit at a time to the egg yolk mixture whisking constantly to temper, until the temp is equal to that of the stuff on the stove. Once it's a temp, pour the rest in and whisk.
- 5. Add it all back to your pot now and warm yet again, whisking constantly. Should reach about 150 degrees or nappe (if you put a rubber spatula in, and rub your finger through the middle it shouldn't seep down see, we all learned something new 😊)
- 6. Put plastic wrap right on top of the mixture so it doesn't form a skin and refrigerate until cool (a few hours at least, you should really do it overnight)
- 7. Add it to your ice cream machine and follow its directions.
- 8. When you're ready to eat it, let it sit out for about 10 minutes to soften.




Please remember now that Brian and Heather are simply members (just like all of us), we need to grant them the ability to enjoy the club with their friends.
